I. About this Addendum

This Addendum applies solely with respect to personal information processing activities that are subject to the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 as amended by the California Privacy Rights Act of 2020 (collectively, the "CCPA"). II. Categories of personal information collected

 - personal information that reveals social security, driver's license, state identification card, or passport number
 - racial or ethnic origin, citizenship or immigration status, religious or philosophical beliefs, or union membership
 - the contents of a California resident's mail, email, and text messages
 - personal information collected and analyzed concerning a California resident's health
 - personal information collected and analyzed concerning a California resident's sex life or sexual orientation.

V. Selling and sharing personal information

We do not sell or share personal information to or with third parties nor have we done so in the preceding 12 months.

VI. Children's privacy

Our services are not intended for children under 16 years of age. We do not knowingly collect, use or disclose personal information from children under 16 years of age.

VII. Retention of your personal information

The length of time we intend to retain your personal information for is set out in our Privacy Statement under "How long will we keep your personal data for?".

VIII. Your rights under the CCPA

The CCPA provides you with the following rights with respect to your personal information:

- The right to know information about the categories and sources of personal information collected; the purposes for which the personal information is collected, used, shared, and disclosed; and the categories of third parties to which personal information is disclosed.
- The right to access specific information about personal information collected.
- The right to request correction of inaccurate personal information that we maintain.

- The right to request deletion of personal information that we have collected or maintain, subject to certain exceptions.
- If we are deemed to sell or share your personal information, the right to opt-out of the sale or sharing of your personal information.
- The right to freedom from discrimination in connection with the exercise of your CCPA rights.

Note that as we do not do not collect or process sensitive personal information for purposes of inferring characteristics about individuals, nor use or disclose such information to any third parties for any other purposes other than as expressly permitted by the CCPA, we do not offer a right to limit the use or disclosure of such information.

When contacting us in connection with any of your rights (described above), you may need to provide sufficient identifying information before your request can be processed. We will need to verify your identity to a reasonable degree of certainty by verifying at least two data points that you previously provided to us and which we have determined to be reliable for the purpose of verifying identities; this information may include your name, address, birth date or other means of identification as appropriate in each case. Note that with respect to requests to know specific pieces of personal information, we may require three data points to verify your identity. We may limit or deny access to personal information only where permitted by law.

IX. How to exercise your rights

You may also use an authorized agent to submit certain privacy rights requests (e.g., requests to know or delete) on your behalf. If you use an authorized agent to submit such requests, we may require that: (1) the authorized agent provide proof of your written permission; and (2) you verify your identity directly with us. These requirements do not apply if you have provided the authorized agent with a power of attorney pursuant to California Probate Code sections 4000 to 4465.

X. Your privacy rights under the California "Shine the Light" law

Under California Civil Code Section 1798.83, if you are a California resident and your business relationship with us is primarily for personal, family or household purposes, you may request certain data regarding our disclosure, if any, of personal information to third parties for the third parties' direct marketing purposes. We do not disclose personal information obtained through our website or services to third parties for their direct marketing purposes. Accordingly, we have no obligations under California Civil Code § 1798.83.

XI. Do not track disclosure

Third parties such as advertising networks, analytics providers and widget providers may collect information, including personal information, about your online activities over time and across

different websites when you access or use our services. Currently, various browsers offer a "Do Not Track" option, but there is no standard for how "Do Not Track" should work on commercial websites. Due to lack of such standards, our websites do not respond to "Do Not Track" consumer browser settings.
